This formation is a forest of deciduous trees needing a lot of rainfall. In the Sierra Nevada, there are currently only traces of these trees in shady ravines.

The leafy forest would be formed by species as rare as the Swedish mountain ash (*Sorbus hybrida*), *Sorbus intermedia*, mountain rowan (*Sorbus torminalis*), yew (*Taxus baccata*),

birch (*Betula pendula* subsp. *fontqueri*), holly (*Ilex aquifolium*), and some others that are somewhat easier to find but never abundant, such as the whitebeam (*Sorbus aria*), goat willow (*Salix caprea*), wild cherry (*Prunus avium*), maple (*Acer opalus* subsp. *granatense*), etc.
