## Pyrenean Oaks





The Pyrenean oaks (*Quercus pyrenaica*) are rare in the south of the Iberian Peninsula. The most extensive forests are in the Sierra Nevada.

They grow between 1,100-1,800 m of altitude, in deeply acid soils and shady areas. They require annual precipitation greater than 600 l/m <sup>2</sup>.

Sprinkled among the oak groves are is sprinkled with mulberry bushes (Sorbus aria, Sorbus torminalis) and maple trees (Acer opalus subsp. granatense), ash trees (Fraxinus angustifolia), cherry trees (Prunus avium), etc.
