Bujeo is a piece of land that can accumulate a lot of water during rainy periods and retain this water for a good part of the year. Humans then clarify this soil, developing a pasture sprinkled with olive trees and oleaster (the roots helping to stabilize the soil when the clay dries or cracks) and palms.

Adequate livestock management favours flower diversity. When overexploited, the concentration of thorny plants, bugloss and knotweeds increases (species of little interest to cattle).
